DEVOTIONS

Think about devotions as a continuation of our community's worship. The following basic pattern could be one way of forming your household's devotions. Adapt as necessary!

GATHERING

♣ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

Prayer of the Week

God, you describe your kingdom as a joy-filled, expectant wedding celebration to which we have been invited. We confess to you that sometimes we are so distracted by our everyday lives that we miss the invitation and miss the joy. Thank you for not giving up on us. Invite us again and again, that we might not miss out on the joy you offer us. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- **Highs & Lows:** What was the most joyful part of your day? What happened that was not a joy-filled moment?
- Thinking about This Week's Story: Part of the parable that Jesus tells is about missed opportunities of God's joy. How did you experience God's joy today? In what way might you have missed it?
- Getting Ready for Next Week's Story: Jesus tells a story about how a master provides money to his servants. Some invest the money wisely and some invest it poorly. How have you spent your time or money today?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

[⊕] Dear God [point up], You invite each of us [point to each person] to your banquet.

Fill us with your joy and love. Amen.

CLOSING

If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.

Partial & Traditions: A Blessing to Share

With permission, mark one another with the sign of the cross on the forehead, and say, "You are invited to God's banquet of love and joy. Amen."
